Full Funding

1) Life Saving Science, Safe Sleep Saves Lives

Penn High School - John Gensic, Holly Austin, Kylee Wetzel, Antonia Boger-May Grade 9-12, 490-1000 students annually

Awarded \$1,800

3D infant model kits that work in coordination with a mobile app to collect data on oxygen saturation in a baby in different positions. This will help teach students about safe sleep for infants and blood oxygen levels as well as engage students in ways to help prevent SIDS across the community

2) Discovery Archers eSports

Discovery Middle School – James Howard and Tanner Givens 6th-8th, 40 students annually

Awarded \$1,480

eSports is rapidly gaining popularity and has a successful team at Penn High School. This grant will purchase consoles, controllers and games as well as an esports membership to allow DMS to start their first eSports team and help students engage in the team atmosphere.

3) Moran K-5 Musical Equipment

Focus on Moran but available to all elementary classrooms- Laura Scott and Jessie Kinney Grades K-5, 437+ students annually

Awarded \$3,778

Equipment to produce Moran's first musical. This will give students in a title one school and opportunity to experience the performing arts and is a collaboration with the school's PTA to assist in funding. Speakers, mixers and cables used in the production will be shared with all 11 elementary schools in the district.

4) Spin Success Pottery Wheels

Grissom Middle School – Elizabeth Marshall 6-8, 390 students annually

Awarded \$3,321.68

Grissom is the only middle school in the district that offers full year art in 7th and 8th grade. The addition of two pottery wheels will give students an opportunity to learn new skills and grow in knowledge and appreciation for ceramics.

5) Studying the Little Things that make a Huge Difference

Penn High School- Antonia Boger-May, John Gensic, Brendan Tubbs $11^{th}~\&~12^{th}$, 270 students annually

Awarded \$900

Equipment for a polymerase chain reaction and gel electrophoresis labs to help students research DNA and how biotechnology can be used. These funds will be combined with a grant from New England Labs and student fees to cover the cost of the program for upper-level biology classes. Through a partnership with Ivy Tech students can use this equipment to work with the college's DNA barcoding equipment and expand their knowledge.

6) See it and 3D it

Horizon- Julia Rulli Grades K-5, 500+ students

Awarded \$535

Purchase of a 3D printer for Horizon's STEAM lab to build excitement and engagement creating models and using ratio and scale to recreate real objects.

7) Growing a Better School Environment Vertically

Penn High School – Lee Morris, Lindsay Soard, John Gensic Grades 9-12, 430 directly 3500 indirectly

Awarded \$999

Funds will be used to purchase a vertical garden home kit and hydroponic garden tower system along with funds raised by a succulent sale held by the plant club. These garden items will help biology classes study photosyntheseis, nutrient cycling, respiration and more.
